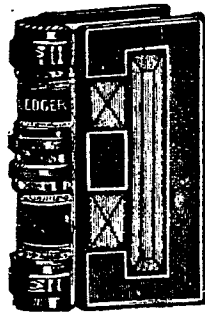

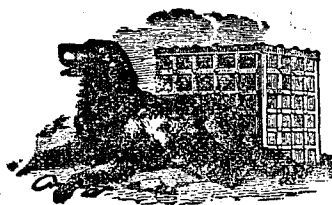

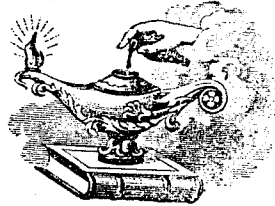

## PREFACE.

---

In presenting this, the really first number of the SALEM DIRECTORY, we will say that there is a number of mistakes in it that were unavoidable, owing to the absence of any work of the kind as a guide. These we hope to avoid in the issue of the Directory for next year. There is not as yet an accurate map of the city and the numerous additions that have been made since the town was originally surveyed by the proprietor "Salem proper," Dr. W. H. Willson. Next year we hope to present in our Directory an accurate map, to be made by a gentleman in every way competent for that business. And we ask the indulgence of our patrons for not presenting one this year, as it would have to be sent to San Francisco to be lithographed, and this would consume more time than we could spare. There was, it is true, a Directory published in 1867, but none has appeared since.

We have issued this Directory as a pioneer of succeeding years, and shall, and intend, it to be a permanent institution of this city. The compiler of this work first arrived in Salem in the fall of 1847, and this city has been his place of residence ever since, though some of the time he has been elsewhere.

The book is not issued for speculation but for permanency and accuracy, so that a future historian of Oregon could turn to its pages for correct information. We feel confident that this number will contain information that will interest all of our patrons and readers; among other things the story of Salem from the earliest settlement up to the time when a great portion were here or have means of knowing of the incidents that have transpired. Some things we publish may appear somewhat foreign to a city Directory, but they are inserted for those who were not here and may desire to inform others. To Rev. L. H. Judson, for his History of Salem, and to other gentlemen who have so generously furnished us with accounts of incidents which happened years ago, we tender our thanks, and feel confident that the reading public will appreciate their labors as well as our humble efforts.—J. 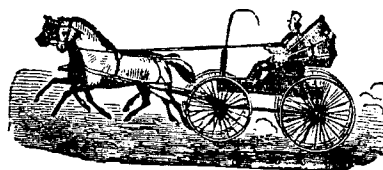
