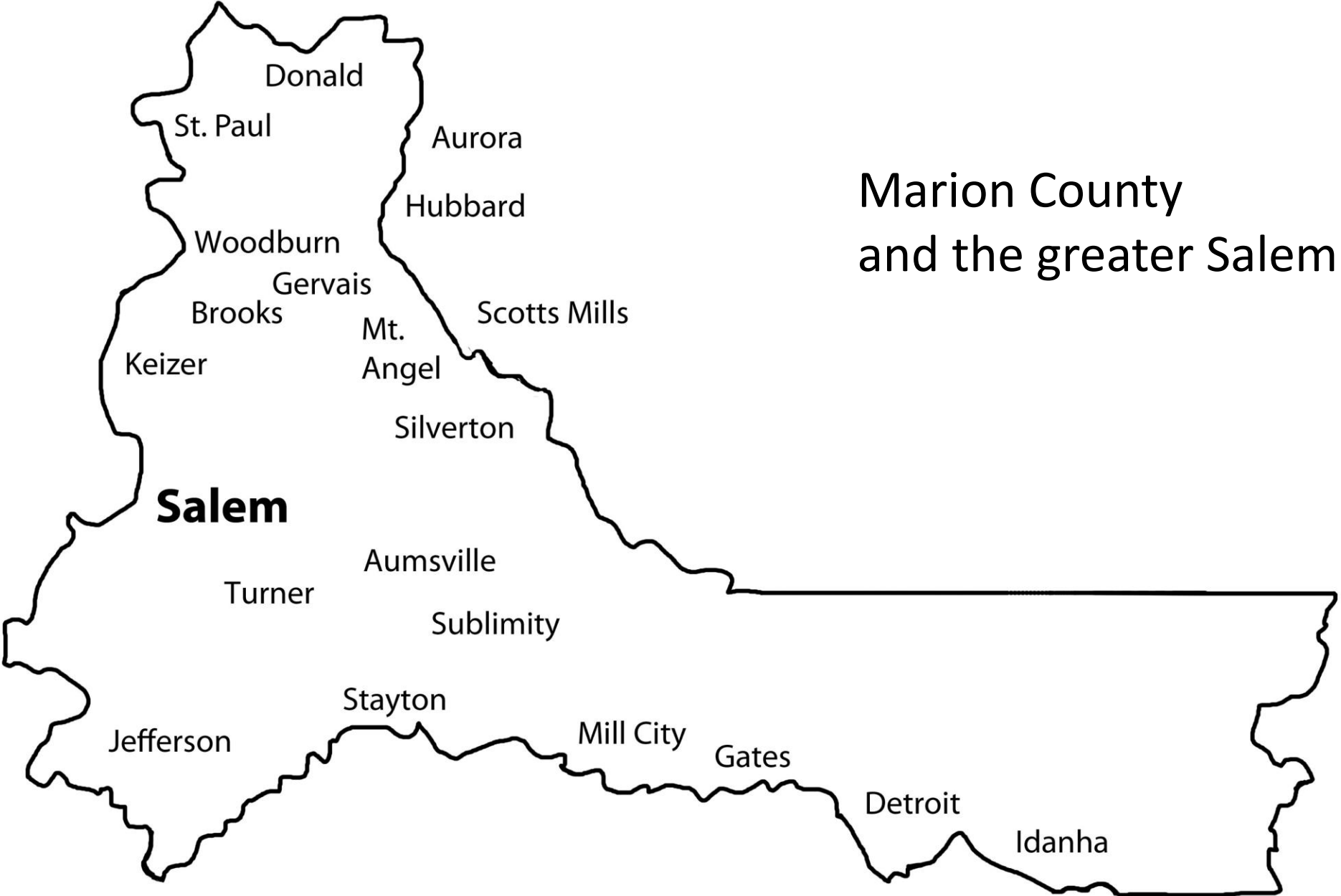

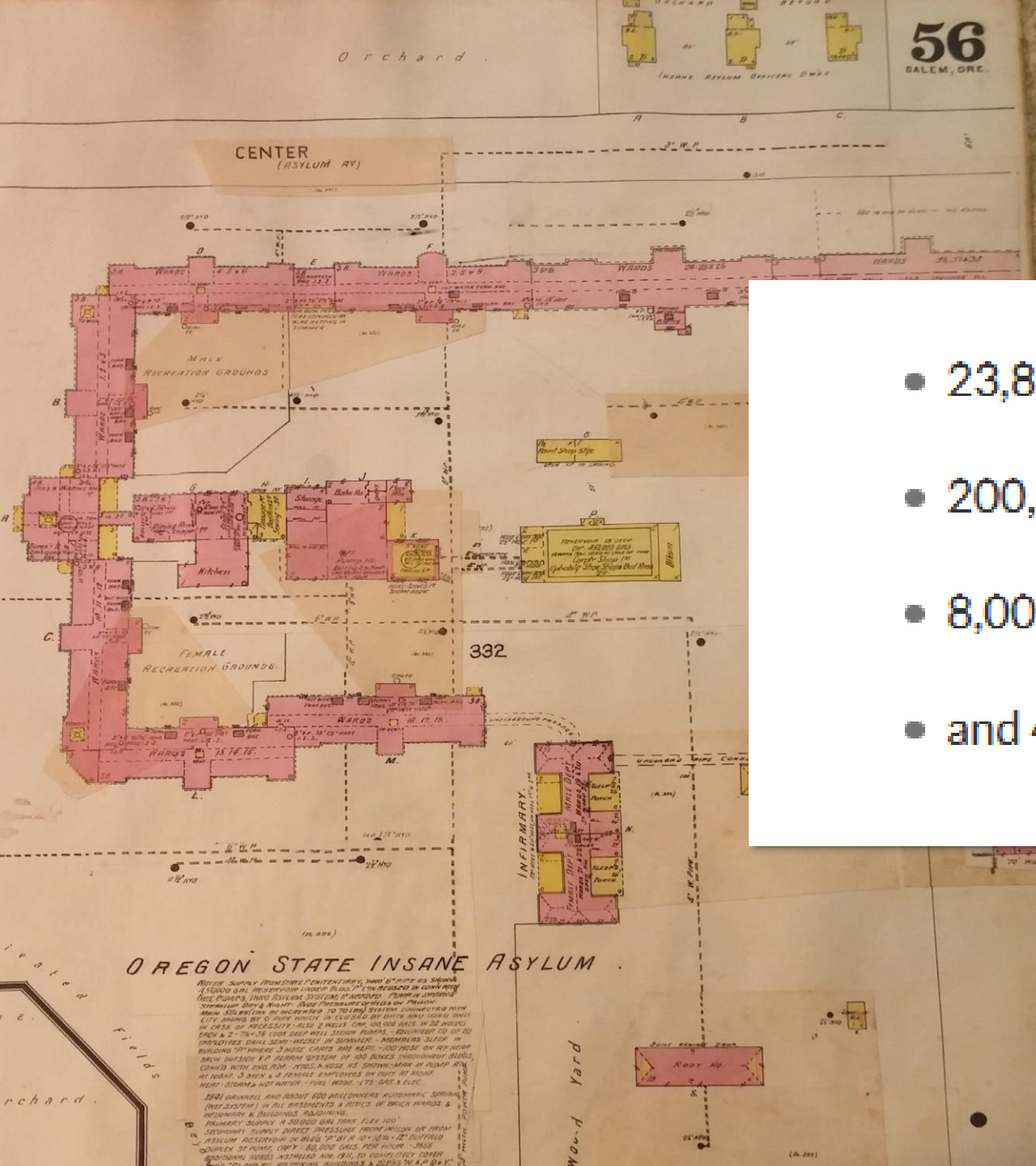




Methodist Mission to Oregon 1834-1844

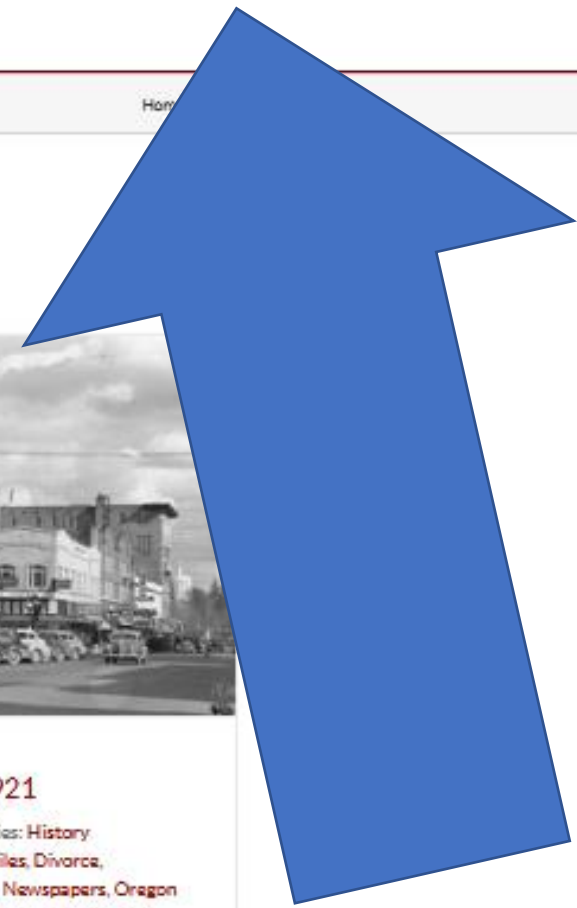

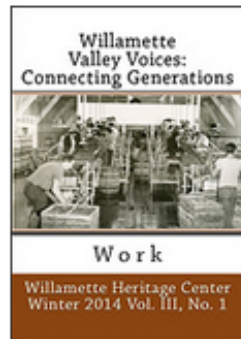

All Willamette Valley Voices editions are available here in digital format for free; hard copies may be purchased in person at the WHC for \$10.

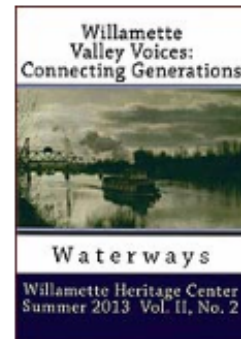

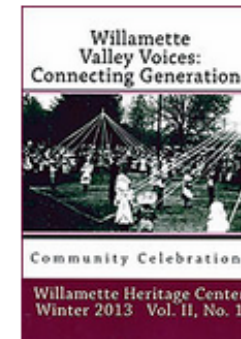
