STATEHOUSE, Salem. — (Special.)—Representative Leach of Multnomah, when questioned on the proposed bill to make steelhead a game fish said, "The purpose of the bill would be to make the steelhead fish a game fish in every stream in the state of Oregon." 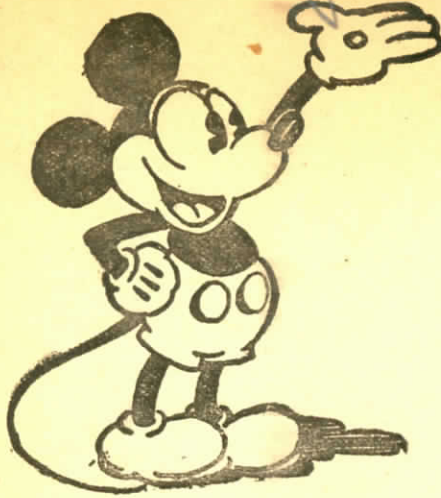

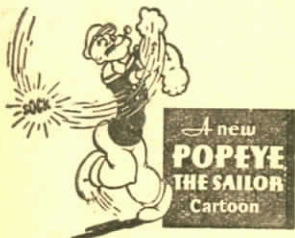

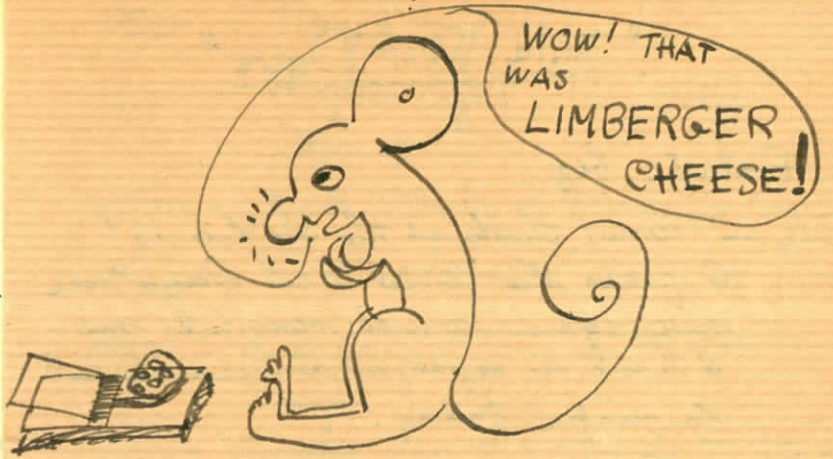
